Colin Thompsen will begin his high school career at Flowing Wells.


These along with our other students and teachers will be recognized on Sunday, August 7.

Pastor's Note

Revolution. This word stood out to me as I heard clips on the news from the opening night of the Democratic National Convention. As Sen. Bernie Sanders spoke, he told his supporters the revolution that began during his campaign is not over and will continue. People cheered.

Revolution. It is a strong word. Depending on the context, it could put fear into your heart. How many political revolutions could we point to in world history full of unrest, protests, conflict, and violence, even if for an ideal of something better? And yet, how many people have benefited from revolutions that change the way people live, work, and experience life for the better? Revolutions are not new to human beings, and they point to the fact that change is sometimes a necessary thing for us.

When we look at the New Testament and the stories of Jesus life, we see that he was a revolutionary. His words and actions and his teachings about God, if taken seriously, guided changes for society and for the way people think and act. The stories of his life and ministry challenge structures of oppression and injustice we still see at work in our world today. They challenge our inclinations toward greed and narcissism and suggest outrageous things in their place: seek God's Reign above everything else; love God and structure your whole life on this love; the first shall be last; pray for your enemies; those who lose their life will find it; if you want to be great you must serve.

A question we should always be asking is how are we to respond to the revolutionary words and actions of Jesus? Are these just stories to prompt deep thoughts? Can we leave it at that? What do they demand of our life? How does what we know about Jesus and how we experience God move us to live and be the body of Christ in the world? What does this mean for the mission of our church? During worship in August we'll take a look at some of these stories and ask these questions...and more...

It is the beginning of a conversation that will move beyond our Sunday worship as the board has asked the Ministry Formation Team to use our core values to discern our mission and calling today and to lead us in an assessment of what physical (people and facility) and economic resources we need to fulfill this mission. It is an exciting time to be the church as changes continue all around us—exciting to see how God's gifts lead us to a faithful response to the needs among those changes. As you see in the article on Mission First! we are not alone in this exploration and discernment of mission.

Thursday Small Group Bible Study




