

#### Poor People's Campaign: A National Call for Moral Revival

The Poor People's Campaign, led by Disciples minister Rev. Dr. William Barber, III, is gaining traction. With articles in both The Christian Century and The Guardian, as well as other outlets, the call for moral revival is highlighting the reality of many living on the margins.

The campaign calls for healing of the deep wounds of racism, militarism, and poverty. The 2017 General Assembly adopted a resolution (GA 1740) in support of this campaign. #### Youth Mental Health First Aid Training (for adults)

Saturday, January 27, 8:00am-4:30pm

St. Francis in the Foothills United Methodist Church, 5725 E. River Rd. Learn how to recognize and help a youth who may be developing a mental health problem or experiencing a mental health or substance abuse crisis. This program is designed for teachers, family members, friends, school personnel, social service and agency staff, and neighbors to increase mental health literacy, decrease stigmatizing attitudes in our communities, and to increase appropriate and early help-seeking by young people with mental health issues. To register, call Interfaith Community Services (ICS), 297-6049. Registration requires a fee of approximately \$30 (to be confirmed), which includes a booklet of materials covered in the training.

#### **Pastor's Note**

We begin a new year all too aware of the need for God's transformative presence in the world. Whether in our lives, the lives of loved ones, or in the life of those we see in need in our community and world, we long for wrongs to be made right; violence to cease; peace to reign; and for compassion, rather than fear or greed, to guide decisions, policies, and action. Rather than be discouraged, our faith prompts us to hold on to the promise of God's faithfulness, steadfast love, and work to heal and mend us all. As a community of faith, we commit to regularly gather together for prayer and worship and to work together in acts of justice, love, compassion, and care. As we Seek God, learn to Love Like Jesus, and Serve the World, we do so as people of hope—people who, as Reverend Victoria Safford writes in her poem (below), have a mission "to plant ourselves at the gates of Hope" in order to see and share the vision of what God's transformative power brings. This must be our way forward for 2018.

#### The Gates of Hope

A poem on hope by Reverend Victoria Safford.

Our mission is to plant ourselves at the gates of Hope— Not the prudent gates of Optimism, Which are somewhat narrower. Not the stalwart, boring gates of Common Sense; Nor the strident gates of Self-Righteousness, Which creak on shrill and angry hinges (People cannot hear us there; they cannot pass through) Nor the cheerful, flimsy garden gate of "Everything is gonna' be all right." But a different, sometimes lonely place, The place of truth-telling, About your own soul first of all and its condition. The place of resistance and defiance, The piece of ground from which you see the world Both as it is and as it could be As it will be:

The place from which you glimpse not only struggle,
But the joy of the struggle.
And we stand there, beckoning and calling,

Telling people what we are seeing

Asking people what they see.
