Pastor's Note

I have shared Maya Spector's poem for spring, "Jailbreak," before, but think its words are so appropriate for the summer months when we typically experience a break from our regular routines. The change of pace can makes us realize how stuck we sometimes are in the way we do things, the way we think, and even the way we see the world. It can remind us that God does not want us stuck in the place we are, but always growing. Growing in understanding, love, and compassion. Growing in wisdom and courage. Growing in seeing what it takes for God's will to be done "on earth as in heaven" as well as how we must adjust our priorities.

Especially in this time of congregational discernment and our facilitators in this process pushing us to reclaim our call to evangelism, this poem reminds us of our constant need to be open to the work of the Spirit within us. It is work that can only happen when we listen deeply to God, to one another, and to new voices we have not considered before. So...are you up for it? Listening for what may challenge you? Considering new ideas? Growing in Christ?

Inevitably, growth means change. We seek a growth that, though sometimes is slow, will guide our transformation into the likeness of the One we worship. "Lose your determination to remain unchanged," Spector writes. Summertime pushes us in this direction. The direction to "break out," to "stop holding back the blossoming," to be open to the "gentle nudge" that "carries behind it the force of a flash flood." Are you ready? Are you ready to acknowledge the gentle nudge and put aside fear? Are you ready for the adventure of the flash flood—the quick moving, forceful waters—that will come?

Jailbreak

It's time to break out— Jailbreak time. Time to punch our way out of the dark winter prison. Lilacs are doing it in sudden explosions of soft purple. And the jasmine vines, and ranunculus, too. There is no jailer powerful enough to hold Spring contained. Let that be a lesson. Stop holding back the blossoming Quit shutting eyes and gritting teeth, curling fingers into fists, hunching shoulders. Lose your determination to remain unchanged. All the forces of nature want you to open, Their gentle nudge carries behind it the force of a flash flood. Why make a cell your home when the door is unlocked and the garden is waiting for you.

Forward Together: Christian Spiritual Discernment Update

Participants from First Christian's membership met for the second session of our spiritual discernment process on June 23. We focused on the identity of our congregation: our history, our personal experiences that ignited passion, core values, and relevant data of our current time and place. We affirmed the ways our

history has shaped us to now and the legacy we hope to carry with us into the future. In addition, the group began an honest assessment around all the current ministries and programs of the congregation, evaluating passion and energy level as well as growing edges.

As our facilitators emphasize the need to embrace our call to evangelism, for the next meeting participants are invited to reflect on the session and come prepared with one simple phrase that describes who we are as a congregation. In addition, participants are asked to engage in the spiritual practice of a weekly examen (based on Ignatian spirituality).

Simple Examen – Done Once a Week

- Make yourself comfortable and set aside some quiet time for this prayer. You may want to light a candle or ring a chime to invite yourself into contemplation.
- Rest into silence for a few moments.
- Ask God's Spirit to lead you in this prayer.
- Review your week's experience at First Christian (worship, outreach, business meetings, fellowship, classes).
 - If you could make any one moment last longer, which would it be? What happened in that moment that made it so life-giving? Sit with that moment and allow it to give you life again. Offer your gratitude to God for that moment.
 - If you could go back and alter any one moment in your week's experience at church, which would it be? What made that moment so difficult? Sit with that moment in the light of God's love and allow yourself to feel whatever emotion you have. Offer that moment to God for healing.
- Make a note of these two moments in your week.
- Take time for silence. Allow the Spirit to speak to you and allow you to learn from these moments.
- End by giving thanks to God for all the ways God has been with you—through the joy and the pain.

All members of the congregation are invited to participate in these practices as well and to continue praying for this process.
