Safe Interactions Training for All Leaders and Volunteers Saturday, October 13 Option 1: 8:30am – 12 noon OR Option 2: 1:00pm – 4:30pm



In 2017, First Christian Church adopted the Safe Interaction Policy for our

congregation. This policy provides guidelines for how we interact with each other, particularly youth and vulnerable adults; establishes when we must report incidents to civil and church authorities; defines what constitutes an incident; and provides an overall structure to help assure protection and respect for those participating in the church. The policy and its training requirement for all employees and volunteers also keep us within our insurance carrier's guidelines.

The interactive and thought-provoking training will answer such questions as:

- How do I avoid misunderstandings of my intentions with my behavior?
- What constitutes abuse, neglect and exploitation? What are the signs?
- To whom, under what circumstances and what do I report to civil and church authorities? What are the timelines?
- Who is a vulnerable adult? Who is a youth?
- Who has to know this information?

The training is required for all church employees, designated leaders, and those volunteering with youth and vulnerable adults. Others can take the training as well. The last time we offered this training, some individuals attended the training because they felt they could benefit from the information or because they thought they might like to volunteer in the future.

The training will take place on Saturday, October 13, 2018 and will be offered at two separate times. The **first option** is from 08:30 am to 12:00 noon. **The second option** is from 01:00 pm to 04:30 pm. If you are a church leader, employee, or volunteer who has not yet taken this training please arrange to attend **one** of these sessions. **Please call the church office or Debbie Stadle by October 11 to enroll.** If you are someone who leads by example, participates in church activities, and are interested in the training, you are also welcome to enroll.

A Note from the Stewardship Team!

Fall is already upon us! Though Autumn in Tucson is largely a non-event where weather is concerned, the season brings with it a number of things, most of which seem to be pumpkin-spiced flavored. Wedged somewhere between the back-to-school frenzy and noticeably earlier sunsets is the annual Stewardship focus at church. Each year this takes on a different look and approach, always adapting to our current needs and aspirations. It inspires us and adds something to our lives, be it appreciation for all our church does for us and our community or a new perspective on our role as faithful caretakers (stewards) of the gifts God gives us and what that can mean in our lives. Yet, the stewardship focus always brings us to the same place: a point to assess the links between our hopes, intentions, and real world plans. This is always an awkward ask, as it calls for a decision that weighs heavy and can't be made lightly. Yet, we all must arrive at some decision on our personal response to participate in this spiritual practice.

This year's stewardship focus, however, is unique. As we all know, we are currently undergoing a critical discernment process to determine the direction in which FCC Tucson proceeds over the next several years. Because the discernment process shows promise in guiding our future direction and goals, the church board made the decision to extend the current budget throughout the first quarter of 2019 in order for a complete budget to be created once we know more about our areas of focus.

This means we have a very unique request this year: we would like to ask everyone to continue their 2018 pledge through the first quarter of 2019 and to begin prayerful consideration for supporting wherever the discernment process leads our ministry. And if you have never tried giving via a pledge before, this is a perfect time to attempt this spiritual discipline for a three month trial period!

Questions you may have upon reading this:

- "Wait, can I just pledge for the year like always?" Yes, you can. Just realize you will be asked to re-confirm once the new budget is ready.
- "Why is pledging such a big thing, again?" Your gifts are a way of giving thanks and joining in God's work through ministries at FCC. They are appreciated however you give them. For you, pledging is a way of practicing giving in a regular way. For the church, pledges enable an accurate plan for our ministries for the year. Un-pledged offerings can fluctuate a lot and make it difficult to plan ahead. Additionally, if you want to claim your donations on your taxes, they'll have to be identifiable to you.
- "Why would this be a good time to start pledging?" Small, trial goals are always a good way to start something new. The timing lines up with New Year's resolutions, and just at the time most people have forgotten their resolutions, you will have met your goal! By then, you'll have an idea of how pledging fits in your life and what you would like to pledge for the rest of the year. If you already pledge, this could be a nice trial for something you haven't done before, such as giving at a different interval or setting up auto -payment with your bank.

During worship on Sunday, October 28 you will have the opportunity to reaffirm your current pledge or begin a new trial pledge. As in years past, cards will be available for you to fill out and place in the offering plate. As always, the information you provide remains confidential.

Providing Emergency Relief in the Philippines after Typhoon Ompong September 19, 2018

While the mid-Atlantic coast of the U.S. still struggles with the aftermath of Hurricane Florence, with many communities still cut off from flooding due to rivers that are only now beginning to crest, Typhoon Mangkhut -- known as Ompong in the Philippines -- made landfall on the

northern tip of Luzon on Friday night local time and has decimated much of the Philippines with winds of over 125 mph. Rev. Melzar Labuntog, General Secretary of the United Church of Christ in the Philippines, reports that there are upwards of 2500 church families who are in need of food due to their homes and livelihoods being destroyed. Forty-nine of the Church's communities need seeds to replant gardens and farms that were washed away. Many people were buried alive in landslides in the areas of Baguio City, Kayapa, Nueva Vizcaya and Itugon, and Benguet; 41 bodies have been retrieved with more expected to be.

Through Global Ministries, our partner the United Church of Christ in the Philippines, has requested our help in channeling monetary aid, medical supplies, food, and monies to assist families who have been directly affected by this severe storm. Week of Compassion will continue to work with our partners in the days and months ahead to help communities impacted by this devastating typhoon to rebuild. We seek your prayers for those who are grieving, for those are caring for their neighbors, and for the restoration of these communities. Your continued gifts to Week of Compassion will, through the work of our partners, bring help where it is needed. Thank you.
