Worship this Month



February 10 marks the beginning of a new focus in worship as we celebrate God's "Abounding Generosity" toward us. Tied to this celebration, we also hear God's invitation to generously share our gifts with others. God invites us to bring all that we are and all that we have when we become a follower of Jesus. It is a journey meant both to form us

more into the image of Christ through the discipline of study, worship, prayer, service, and generosity; as well as to strengthen us in becoming powerful agents for the good that God is doing in our world.

When we make an intentional decision about what we bring before Christ, we extend a blessing of health and wholeness to all of creation, because we are certain that this is ultimately what God desires. Learnings from Discernment

As Pastor Ailsa has shared with us previously, the Discernment process concerning future directions for First Christian and its ministries was attended by a large number of congregants last year, and it provided an encouraging wealth of *insights, information, and inspiration* for our consideration and implementation.

As a member new to the church, it was helpful for me to learn about the historic legacy and significance of this sacred institution, its many gifted and prophetic leaders and its legions of faithful and generous members.

I have been praying about ways in which I might best serve the church in the next phases of the search for new ways to grow and strengthen God's kingdom. I will share my skills and knowledge as an historical architect and the experiences *and* insights gained through years of service to other churches and cultural institutions in a number of management, design, research, and planning projects. I bring also my love of the Christian Church/Disciples of Christ as a 4th generation member and servant to its causes.

But far more significant than these things are some important lessons that were revealed to me as the discernment process reached its exciting conclusion last fall. These lessons are represented by four words that will guide me as watchwords in our shared pursuit, refinement and realization of new ideas and goals for growth and revitalization. These four key words are **spirituality, stewardship, sustainability, and service.**

"Spirituality" reminds me that I must first, and always, listen to and be faithful to God by creating and evaluating new ideas and goals for the church in the context of and by the standards of the Holy Spirit's wishes and plans for the kingdom.

"Stewardship" reminds me, and reinforces the fundamental fact, that FCC has been blessed by having great resources of dedicated servants and leaders, as well as exceptional physical resources built for the exalted and singular purposes of worship, education and service, and that we have a great responsibility to ensure that these resources are preserved, nurtured and enhanced for the work ahead.

"Sustainability" reminds me that we have a significant challenge before us to work faithfully towards building a secure economic future as we explore ways to determine appropriate use and development of our physical property resources as they relate to mission fulfillment.

"Service" is a final reminder that we do all of this in service to our great and loving God, to the world in need, to our host community, and for our church and each other, our sisters and brothers in Christ.

I am grateful to God that I am able to participate with FCC in this endeavor, and I pray that I will follow faithfully the guidance ordained in these learnings. I hope that you will consider ways to share your gifts in our journey forward. Amen.
