## **Forward Together Updates:**

**1. Listening Campaign:** Listeners continue to meet with businesses and organizations in the community. One development so far is a connection with the campus food pantry at the University of Arizona. Since one leading

#### 2. Building:

**Property Maintenance Person:** The team has postponed the posting of the position until we have a better estimate of the 2020 proposed budget. In the meantime, we express gratitude to our members attending to property matters and our Office Manager, Jenna Hosler, for addressing property needs.

**Sanctuary Updates:** We had a great response to the chair campaign. As of the printing of this issue of the Desert Disciple, funds for 104 had been raised. That surpasses our hope for 100 chairs by the end of September with more time to give. Our overall goal is 200 chairs. See more information on page 4.

**3. Expanding Evangelism through Social Media**: Now is the time to follow First Christian Church on Facebook, if you have not already. Our contract with Social Grace Media began in September, and we look forward to sharing the story of our congregation through social media and an updated website.

Jewish Voice for Peace will set up a "sukkah"--a temporary structure like a ramada--for the Jewish holiday of Sukkot (the plural of sukkah), **October 13 - October 20**. Sukkot is a harvest festival, a time of thinking about shelter and a time when we welcome the stranger. It is also the most joyous holiday in the Jewish calendar, because it follows the intense work of reflection and making amends during Yom Kippur.
