Worship this Month

Mary Oliver's poem, "Messenger," begins with these words: "My work is loving the world." It proceeds to name parts of the natural world which we are to respect and love. "Are my boots old? Is my coat torn?" she asks. "Am I no longer young, and still half-perfect? Let me keep my mind on what matters, which is my work, which is mostly standing still and learning to be astonished." Thank you to all who attended our Congregational Meeting on September 29 and assisted with our 5th Sunday Service Day project. While we listened to reports, we made over 200 sandwiches which will be used as we continue to support our Hospitality Ministry either when we have guests here or at the Casa Alitas Welcome Center on Ajo Way. If you were unable to attend, please call the church office for a copy of the reports from the meeting. Watch for the date of our next Congregational Meeting in December.

Some highlights from the reports include:

- ◆ The stewardship team will meet this month to prepare a budget for presentation to the congregation at the December congregational meeting.
- A task force continues to work on a Safe Church plan for the congregation.
- The nominating committee has begun meeting to prayerfully consider leadership and officers for next year.
- The Trustees will schedule repairs for the Columbarium wall.

They will present on each organization's humanitarian aid mission, the weaponizing of the Sonoran Desert and the Mediterranean Sea by governments, and the prosecution of aid volunteers in each region.

Faith Floods the Courtroom Wednesday, November 20 at 8:00am

Calling on people of faith and conscience to flood the court room on November 20th in Tucson, Arizona and show support of Scott Warren, Human Rights activist facing 20 years of jail for providing lifesaving aid to migrants in the desert. The Interfaith Prayer Service will feature local and national faith leaders calling for an end to the criminalization of humanitarian aid and the fundamental principles of care and compassion. Our presence in the courthouse and the vigil outside will be a visible witness of our support. Let us remember: he is facing prison time for doing that which our faith traditions demand of us — welcoming the stranger, feeding the hungry, offering water to the thirsty. And let's be very clear — any one of us could be on trial.
