### **Pastor's Note**

The Wilderness Is Somewhere We've Been Before by Sara Are

I'm not the first.

That's what I tell myself when I wake up in the wilderness—

Big sky, worried heart, wondering which way to start.

I have been here before.

We have been here before.

For as long as there has been creation,

There has been wilderness.

First it was an endless void, Until God and God's paintbrush painted the sky gold.

And then it was all that lies east of Eden, Which is everywhere that our story unfolds.

So like a child memorizing their home address, You'd think I'd learn my way out of this wilderness.

But like the Israelites who wandered for forty plus years,

I think I'll spend most of my day to day here.

For the wilderness is everywhere that I start to grow.

Cracks in the sidewalk, daisies take hold. And the wilderness is every single place of unknown,

Or when shame and fear move into my home. And the wilderness is where dusty feet tread, Familiar with the truth that we have days left.

So where is God, you ask?

God is in the big sky and in my worried heart. God is the sidewalk cracks where new life starts.

God is in the realization that I am not the first. So may we take these limited days left And remember that we've been here before—God and I and this untamed world. God and the Israelites and the gathered assembly. God and the horizon and the new day beginning.

Wilderness. What does it mean to you? I recently witnessed the wilderness experience of a friend, which caused major disruptions in their life and that of their family. No one could figure out the root of the problem. No one could understand the desperation and angst my friend felt as a body no longer functioned as it should. Then...a diagnosis...acceptance of the condition...willingness to receive treatment...and a journey toward healing.

The crisis of wilderness unearthed things beyond the medical diagnosis: the health of marital and parental relationships, the mental health of those in their circle, and the testing of friendships, to name a few. It seemed as though the wilderness had layers that went deeper and deeper and would never end...until there was nowhere else to go. Facing the stuff of wilderness was not easy. It meant appointments with specialists, therapists, and spiritual leaders. It meant finding support groups and being gracious and forgiving of self. Yet, it carved a way out toward something new with "God and the horizon and the new day beginning."

Lent offers us a time of intentional journeying in the wilderness. Time to stop. Time to be intentional. Time to block distractions that keep us from going into the layers that lead to our healing and wholeness. I hope you decide to take this journey these next six weeks. I hope you seek the support of your faith community as you do, whether in opportunities for worship, Sunday Bible study, Lenten dinners, or other moments of conversation and fellowship. May you experience a blessed Lent!


## **Congregational Meeting & Potluck**

For this reason, the church has a Good Samaritan Fund from which we may offer assistance. If someone asks you for assistance, please direct them to contact the church office Monday - Friday, 9:00am - 1:00pm. Money from the Good Samaritan Fund is dispersed at the Pastor's discretion, and our practice is to offer one-time assistance to each individual we help.

In the last year, the Good Samaritan Fund has helped us give grocery store gift cards, direct cash assistance, pay utility bills, assist in the purchase of medications, and hire an immigration lawyer for a detained individual seeking asylum.

The Good Samaritan Fund is funded by over-and-above donations from church members. You can donate by writing a check to FCC and indicating Good Samaritan Fund on the memo line.
